Dear Lynne,

I am contacting you once again regarding the ongoing affairs of Mr Keith Vaz, MP.

I write to request you consider commencing an investigation into Mr Vaz under the provisions set out in the Criminal Finances Act, under which you are listed as an enforcement authority.

It has been widely reported that Mr Vaz, the Member of Parliament for Leicester East, has amassed an eight home UK property empire valued at over £4 million pounds, despite earning a salary of around £90,000.

It has also been reported that a number of the homes in Mr Vaz's eight strong property empire were bought with cash, including nearly £400,000 for a house in Middlesex. As well as this, I understand from newspaper reports that his wife paid £465,000 for a flat in Pimlico, Central London in December 2005.

In addition to a UK property empire, it is reported Mr Vaz and his wife own several properties in India and that between 1996 and 2001, almost £500,000 was deposited into a series of bank accounts belonging to Mr Vaz.

Mr Vaz currently earns £74,926 as an MP and had received a £15,025 top-up as Home Affairs Select Committee chairman until his resignation in September 2016.

Since 1997 he has declared outside earnings of just £11,950, in addition to rent worth more than £10,000 a year from one of the flats he owns.

He has had known expenses of school fees for his two Children who attended Haberdashers' Aske's boys and girls school until the years 2013 (son) and 2014 (daughter). The annual fees per pupil per annum were £19,470.00 for the last year.
